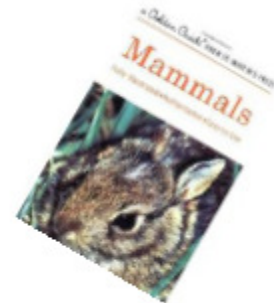


Keystone Active Zone (KAZ) Library Walks
